The third aspect of jewelry involves colored gemstones. Around 80 percent of the world's supply of gemstones is produced by small artisanal miners, mostly in emerging economies, and often under unacceptable working and environmental conditions. While many of the larger companies make an effort to be socially responsible, there is still much to be done in most of the world. Consequently, the Fair Trade movement has moved into gemstone production and thus this label offers a better guarantee that the stones have been produced in a socially and environmentally acceptable manner.

The organic jewelry category signals a move towards a more natural look. While eco-jewelry incorporates all designs and styles of
